Tegalalang Rice paddy Terrace located on the north side of Ubud around 20 minutes' drive. This area is famous tourist attraction for beautiful rice terraces, many tourists who travel to and from Kintamani stopped at this place to witness the beauty of the verdant terraced rice field scenery or having lunch at the restaurant while enjoying the beautiful scenery of terraced rice fields. Tegalalang Rice Terrace is one of the tourist icons in Ubud Bali.

Gunung Kawi Temple at Sebatu is a Hindu Water Temple dedicated to Vishnu, who is said rule over water. The site is located in a dip in land and is surrounded on three sides by stone walls and the fourth by a steep forested slope. The temple complex is built on a natural spring, which feed a series of ponds and pools.

KINTAMANI

Kintamani, Batur and Penelokan villages sit on the rim of the huge Batur caldera about 1,500m above sea level, and offer dramatic views of the active volcano Mount Batur and serene Lake Batur. As well as the lake and the volcano, Kintamani is home to Pura Ulun Danu Batur, one of Bali's key nine directional temples.



Tirta Empul Temple is built around the sacred spring at Tampak Siring. For more than a thousand years, Balinese worshippers have been drawn to Tirta Empul Temple whose sacred spring is said to have been created by Indra and to have curative properties. The tradition continues almost unchanged at the temple today. Over 1000 years old, the temple and its two bathing places have been used by the people for good health and prosperity because of the spring water's curative powers.



Goa Gajah's (Elephant Cave) name is slightly misleading, lending the impression that it's a gigantic dwelling full of elephants. Nevertheless, Goa Gajah 'Elephant Cave' is an archaeological site of significant historical value that makes it a special place to visit. Located on the cool western edge of Bedulu Village, six kilometers out of central Ubud. At the façade of the cave is a relief of various menacing creatures and demons carved right into the rock at the cave entrance. The primary figure was once thought to be an elephant, hence the nickname Elephant Cave.



Tegenungan Waterfall is located at the Tegenungan Kemenuh village, in Gianyar, close to the artist village of Ubud. The waterfall is isolated but has become a popular tourist attraction to explore and relax. It is one of the few waterfalls in Bali that is not situated in highlands or mountainous territory. The amount and clarity of the water at the site depends on rainfall but it contains green surroundings with fresh water that can be swim in
